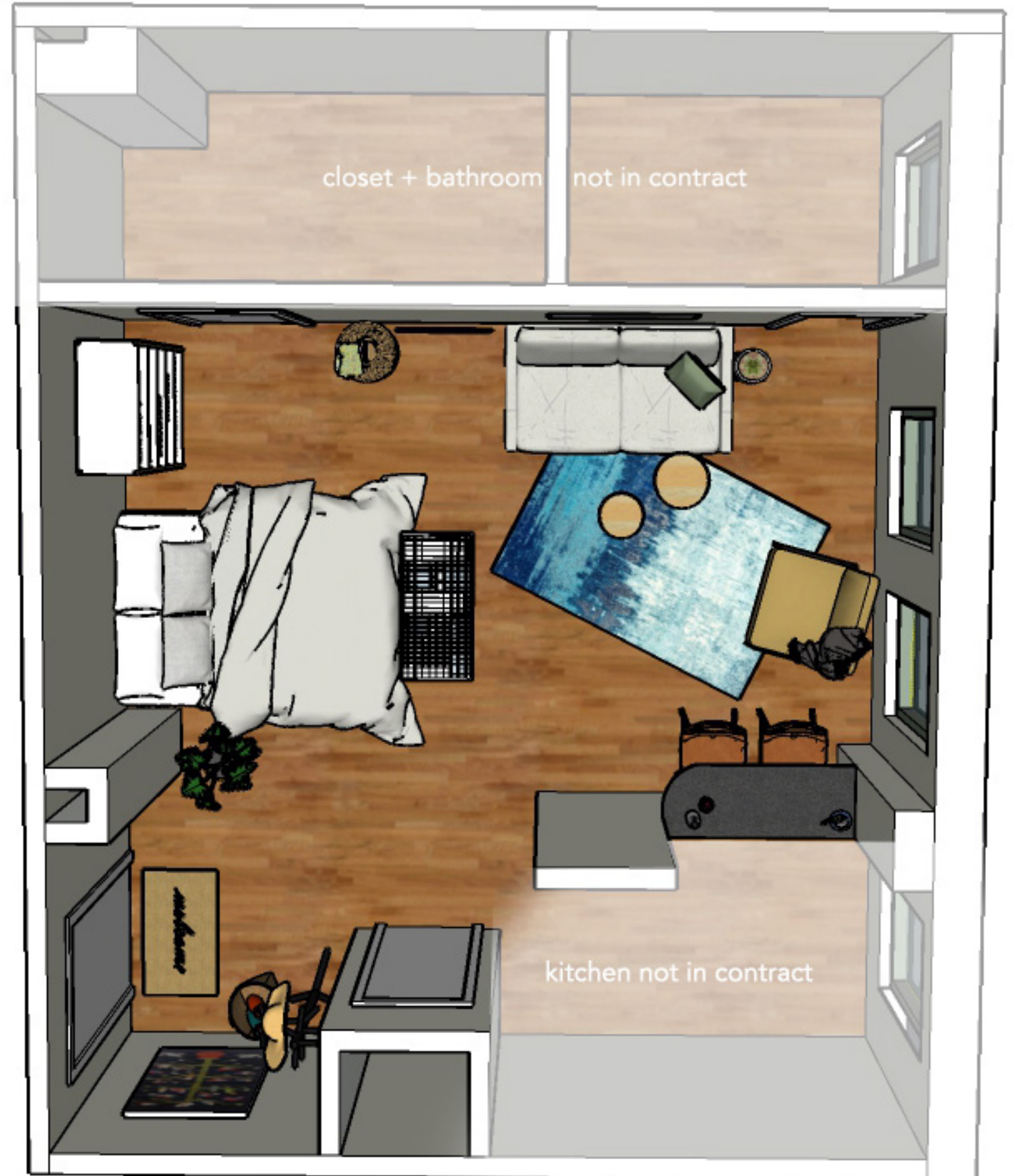

FLOORPLAN

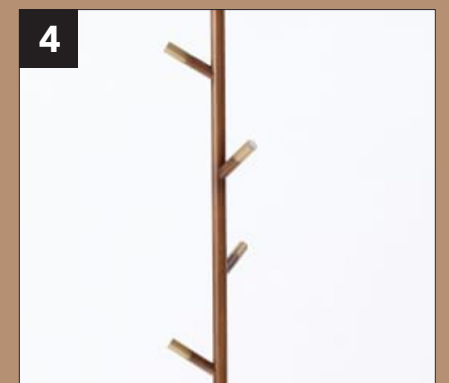
ENTRANCE

Using your smaller rug as a wall hanging will bring warmth to the entryway. A simple welcome mat will zone the area and keep muddy tracks at bay. We are going to up your basket game and give the space a taller, more structured vessel to hold umbrellas. And, to pay tribute to your much-loved “wall hanging,” we are going old school and giving the studio a freestanding, tree-like coat rack

LIVING

Using your large blue area rug to zone the space, we are adding two seating options. First, a small, but cozy, sofa that sits 1-2 people. The orientation gives your guest a new view to experience the space. The second is a lounge chair for one. This layout gives the guest the ability to sit one to five people easily, when including the two bar stools.

SLEEPING

Let's start with a small change—the new palm plant is going to serve as a divider. It will help separate the sleeping area from the new entryway. On a grander note: big, cozy, bedding is going to make the bed an irresistible place to crash, and let's be honest that's the most important part of a rental. Using your unique coffee table and bookshelf, I was able to tuck the bed away, creating its own niche, anchored by a large piece of 3D art centered on the wall.
